THE METHODIST GLOBAL EDUCATION FUND FOR LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT (MGEFLD) – EUROPE

The Methodist Global Education Fund for Leadership Development or MGEFLD is one of the many projects the Global Methodist Education and Leadership Development program initiated under the Global Board of Higher Education and Ministry (GBHEM).

MGEFLD is a fund supporting the network of Methodist organizations assisting educational programs around the globe. The programs implemented under MGEFLD are based on the principle of shared vision, shared responsibilities and shared costs. This principle is a reflection of the interconnectedness and intercultural nature of the United Methodist Church.

The office of MGEFLD-Europe is located at Reutlingen School of Theology, Germany. It is dedicated to assisting theological education in Europe by providing scholarships, supporting events, and providing technical assistance.



MGEFLD – EUROPE SUPPORT AND ASSISTANCE

MGEFLD - Europe provides assistance to individuals and institutions needing help in their academic studies or programs. There are two categories of grants: (a) individuals (students, lecturers/professors, leaders, etc.); and (b) Methodist-related institutions.

(A) INDIVIDUALS

Grants & Scholarship Program (GRASP)

This program is offered to individuals (students, faculty members, lay members and clergies) seeking assistance to apply for degree programs, specialization courses, continuing education, attendance to conferences/seminars/workshops or any special circumstances related to furthering academic studies.

Methodist Academic Program (MAP)

This program is offered to individuals (students, faculty members, consultants, and administrators) seeking assistance to do internship, student/faculty exchange, or consultancy work (training, workshop, etc.) to Methodist-related institutions.



(B) INSTITUTIONS/ORGANIZATIONS

Technical Assistance Program (TAP)

This assistance is offered to Methodist-related institutions seeking assistance or consultancy work to help address their needs. Requested assistance can be related to one or more of the following categories: Library development; Publications; Leadership Development; Fundraising; Information Technology; Program Development; Academic Evaluation; Strategic Planning; and/or Management.

Leadership Development Program (LeD)

This program is offered to Methodist-related institutions seeking assistance to conduct trainings, seminars, workshops or meetings that will strengthen the leadership skills and capabilities of its members.
